Virtual Patient Challenge

Virtual Patient Challenge is an engaging Clinical Case Competition where critical thinking and reasoning skills will be put to the test. Team spirit, adrenaline and enriching problem-based learning experience are guaranteed!

Teams of 5 members can register for the competition if they are up to the challenge of proving themselves to be the most skilled doctors of the future!

The competition is based on solving challenging clinical cases in a digital simulator using an interactive table, both powered by Body Interact.

There will be two rounds where teams will compete against each other. The highest score team from each round will be playing in the Final (28th April) against the other, and the winning team will have a small surprise waiting for them in the closing ceremony.

Session 1: Mental Health at the core of Human Rights

Keywords: Mental Health, Human Rights, Introduction

As medical students, we are extremely susceptible to mental health illnesses. But why is it that this issue is not discussed enough? What is stigma? And how is mental health linked and at the core of human rights? We will try to shed light onto the mental health state of medical students and discover its relation to human rights violations.

Session 2: Gender Identity and Healthcare

Keywords: Gender Identity, Healthcare, Ethical Practice

Gender Identity is a major factor when it comes to the violation of human rights in healthcare systems. We will first discover the aspects of gender identity and expression to then discuss the implication and impact of discrimination against non-binary individuals on their fundamental right to health and healthcare.

Anamnesis: professional mobility 4 months ago, feels isolated, tired, irritated, longs for home

Diagnosis: Culture Shock Syndrome

Cause: Enfacing differences in practices while working in a different cultural and professional environment.

Treatment: Find out how to cure this patient, and how you can take precautions, by joining this Pillar Session!

Session 1: Medicine Without Borders

Keywords: Medical Mobility, Professional Qualification, European Trends

If you have ever asked yourself: what is medical mobility, how can it be done and why should we do it, this session is where you should be! What if there is a database which actually facilitates medical training and mobility in all European countries? Just imagine the opportunity to know everything you need in order to work as a doctor in a foreign country, beforehand. During this session, you will find out how to access the information, training/working conditions across Europe and different life-changing experiences. Session 1: AMR: Escaping the 2019 Titanic

Keywords: Future, Technology, AMR

Public Health

Session 1: Introduction to Global Health: Navigating globalisation and its impacts on health

Keywords: public health, global health, globalisation

The first session of the EMSA Public Health Pillar will begin with the Public Health Team introducing the projects and activities of the pillar to the participants. Then, we will start discussing the differences between public and global health, and their main working areas. We will also get familiar with the different concepts of globalisation while developing ideas on how it may affect global health. By the end of the session, the participants will understand the current trends in global health, challenges faced and its relation with increasing globalisation.





Public Health

Session 2: Climate Action & Sustainability

Keywords: climate change, sustainability, global action

Climate change has undeniable impacts on health as it is one of the greatest man-made health challenges of the 21st century. This session will focus on climate change and its impacts on health and we will be talking about its political importance and EMSA's stance on the issue. We will also create a platform for the participants to discuss and develop ideas regarding sustainable actions on individual, organisational and governmental level. Finally, a fully sustainable pillar session will make its grand debut in this assembly.





Public Health

Session 3: A European Priority: NCDs - Youth Action on Tobacco

Keywords: noncommunicable diseases, tobacco, youth action

In this session, the participants will realize the urgency of Non-Communicable Diseases and the impacts of this increasing threat in Europe. We will focus on tobacco as a leading risk factor for NCDs and the participants will learn and practice the possibilities of primary prevention among children and adolescents as well as methods of smoking cessation in patients. The International Coordinator of Education Against Tobacco (EAT) will be one of the session holders, sharing the details of their unique project while giving interactive messages to the participants to raise awareness on the issue.





Medical Education

Session 1: Which right is right for you?

Keywords: rights, core curriculum, advocacy

Why do the medical students' rights are so different depending on the country of study? What does our medical school faculty expect from us? Besides our school's expectations, what should "we" expect from our school? Throughout this session, you will get your claws into your own colleagues through different scenarios. It will be followed by information of student rights & responsibilities and their guidelines, in addition, discussion of the guidelines that we can use to advocate for a change in our own Medical Schools to achieve a solid and compatible European medical education!





Medical Education

Session 2: Unhiding the Hidden Curriculum

Keywords: continuing professional development, competency, hidden curriculum

How do we develop our professional identity without realizing through this huge process ? Are role models important in making good doctors ?

So far, undergraduate curriculum implemented in medical schools has focused on a formal way of conveying an appropriate level of knowledge and skills with the changes of course content, teaching methods, and examinations but is medical education limited to that?

In our session, we will answer all these questions together and get to know the medical education process as well as discovering how we actually learn in medical schools with a brand-new concept: Hidden Curriculum. We will also try to enlighten the 'hidden' impact of hidden curriculum on medical students with interactive methods focusing on 'self-reflection'.



Medical Education

Session 3: Interprofessional Education and Curriculum: Coming up with an educational program

Keywords: Curriculum, development, IPE

Interprofessional education involves educators and learners from 2 or more health professions and their foundational disciplines who jointly create and foster a collaborative learning environment. Interprofessional education is an important pedagogical approach for preparing health professions students to provide patient care in a collaborative team environment [Buring, 2009]. We can advance high quality in health care by an interdisciplinary approach in order to develop further utilization.

But it should also be considered that different professions' specialization requires both joint and separated curriculums so curriculum development plays a key role in holding the balance.

Come to our session to discover what IPE is and how it is implemented to International and European educational programs. We will be focusing on different approaches, studying possible collaborative educational contents' curriculum development and explore how are "our" curriculums can bring perspective to the topic.

Session 1: Europe at a turning point? - The 2019 Parliament Elections

Keywords: Elections, brexit, EU Institutions

“This time it's not enough to hope for a better future: this time each and every one of us must take responsibility for it too.” - The next European elections take place on 23-26 May 2019. In the light of Brexit, rising national and populist movements as well as the big global challenges of today, they may mark a turning point for the European Union as we know it. What are the big topics discussed in the election campaign? Who is running and who can I vote for? And why are this year's elections so important? This session aims at answering those questions! We will give an overview of the role of the European Parliament in decision-making processes as well as the interplay of the EU institutions and get to discuss the threats and opportunities this year's elections may bring.

Session 2: Medical Mobility and Migration - Challenges for Policy Makers

Keywords: Migration, Healthcare

Healthcare professionals' cross-border mobility increases steadily in a more and more interconnected and globalized world. The increasing mobility implies many opportunities but also risks that affect both the countries of arrival and origin as well as the migrating healthcare workers themselves. What are those potential benefits and risks of medical mobility? How can migration be shaped sustainable so that all parties can benefit from it? Which policy frameworks do we need in order to achieve this? Who is in charge to make respective policies? You will discuss and find some answers to these questions in session two of the European Health Policy Pillar!

Session 3: Medical Mobility and Migration - the Link to Universal Health Coverage

Keywords: Health coverage, equality

The concept of Universal Health Coverage is aiming towards the right to health, based on the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. Every human shall be provided and have access to necessary, high-quality health service, without facing financial hardship. One of its goals is to create a system of protection which provides equality of opportunities for people to enjoy the highest possible level of health. In order to achieve and adapt Universal Healthcare concept, it is important to understand the foundation of healthcare structures, financial models and measurements of universal health coverage. During the session, you will be equipped with the toolkit and information on how to measure and improve the healthcare system in your country and we will discuss the impact of the medical professionals' mobility and migration on Universal Health Coverage.

Ethics of Organ transplantation and brain death

Organ transplantation is associated with a set of ethical questions that are related to the different stages of cadaveric organ transplantation. The harvesting of cadaveric organs poses the question of how to ensure the (informed) consent of donors and how this concern for the autonomy of donors should be balanced against the effort to maximise the number of donor organs. Different legal frameworks will be presented and discussed. Another topic that is closely related to the harvesting of cadaveric organ donation is the concept of brain death.

Another ethical issue relates to the shortage of cadaveric organs. When it comes to the allocation of donor organs, two criteria need to be balanced against one another: namely, the efficiency and urgency of organ transplantation. This leads to several questions such as: Do we have an obligation to split as many donor livers as possible? Is it ethically permissible to exclude a patient from a lifesaving resource just because another patient will probably make more efficient use of the scarce resource?

Forensic Imaging - Reality, Future or Fiction?!

Sarah Heinze is an attending physician and researcher at the Institute of Forensic and Traffic Medicine of Universität Heidelberg. Being specialised in both forensic medicine and radiology she researches at the intersection of these fields. In this talk, she will give you fascinating insights on current and future perspectives in the field of forensic radiology.

Hands on: Urology

This workshop will give you a short and good overview of all relevant testicular diseases. We will perform the ultrasonic examination on testicular models and will discuss in small groups differential diagnosis and disease management. At the end of this course, you will know how to diagnose, treat and manage urologic scrotal diseases.

Recognition of foreign medical professionals in Germany - Seminar

As Germany is one of the biggest health care markets within the European Union many medical professionals are seeking for practising there. This workshop will highlight the criteria that must be fulfilled to practice medicine and start postgraduate medical training in Germany under a full medical license, both for EU and non-EU diplomas.

Hands-On Workshop Minimally Invasive Surgery (General Surgery)

In this multimodality training course, we offer 2,5h of training in small groups with experienced tutors. Students get the chance to learn and improve skills of laparoscopic surgery. Training includes virtual reality simulation of the newest generation with procedural exercises and basic skills on real instruments and silicone models as well as real tissue. Comparable with the setting in the operation room with realistic instruments the students are following a structured practical oriented curriculum for beginners in minimally invasive surgery. This is a unique chance to take the first steps in minimally invasive surgery in a safe environment outside the operating room to improve patient safety.

Mibeg Institute Medicine: Working requirements for foreign physicians in Germany

This Workshop aims to elucidate the path to attain full recognition of a foreign medical degree in order to work as a physician in Germany. In the first part, we will discuss the legal requirements for recognition of medical degrees from EU, EEA and Switzerland as well as from third countries. Another focus will be set on the topic of working with limited registration. Also, we will present the role of the Marburger Bund and how and in which extent it can aid in the process of gaining the German "Approbation". Having covered the legal requirements, we will in the second part of this workshop concentrate on practical achievement. In order to gain full recognition of a foreign medical degree, all applicants have to pass a medical language test. Additionally, applicants from third countries generally also have to participate in a medical knowledge test. We will give an overview of these exams and useful tips for preparation. Furthermore, we will present the current employment situation and job opportunities for physicians and give an introduction of how to successfully apply for a medical position. Finally, we will discuss the post-graduate medical training to become a specialist physician.

Bringing Europeans Together Association Workshops - EU Elections

Hematopoietic stem cell transplantation is a potentially curative therapy for many diseases. The Heidelberg Stemcell Registry (HSR) and the Heidelberg Search Unit work in a global context in order to provide and to identify optimal unrelated stem cell donors for the patients.



Structural competency -New medicine for the inequalities that make us sick

Structural competency explores a new clinical politics for understanding the relationships among race, class, and symptom expression. In clinical settings, such relationships often fall under the rubric of “cultural competency,” an approach that emphasizes recognition of the divergent sociocultural backgrounds of patients and doctors, and the cultural aspects of patients’ illnesses. Increasingly, however, scholars and activists recognize that oft-invisible structural level determinates, biases, inequities, and blind spots shape definitions of health and illness long before doctors or patients enter examination rooms. This evolving literature suggests that conditions that appear from a biomedical framework to result from actions or attitudes of culturally distinct groups need also be understood as resulting from the pathologies of social systems. And, that locating race-based symptoms on the bodies of marginalized persons risks turning a blind eye to the racialized economies in which marginalized and mainstreamed bodies live, work, and attempt to survive.

In order to offer a a new approach to the relationships among race, class, and symptom expression, we offer a structural competency training workshop developed by the Structural Competency Working Group, founded in 2014 and based in the San Francisco Bay Area. Workshop: Anatomy combined with Radiology - Hands on demonstration using the virtual life-size dissection table

What could you expect?

- A comprehensive presentation about our successful concept called “Virtual Anatomy combined with anatomical cadaver dissection”. We generate and use cadaver-specific non-enhanced and contrast-enhanced computed tomography (CT)-datasets from our body donors, presented on PCs next to the dissection table, during the dissection course to strengthen the anatomical knowledge of our students.

A short summary of our own scientific studies, publications and the results to point out the benefits associated with this method.

- A guided tour through our dissection hall, to show how our curriculum concept works.
- A tutor-guided session (1 hour) with the virtual life-size dissection table Anatomage®.

Selected cases are prepared to demonstrate how you could use radiologic imaging techniques to learn anatomy.



Is he who heals always right? Critical thinking in the medical field

Should doctors aim for satisfied patients or the cure of disease?

Medical practice has always been a balancing act between treatment of disease and empathy for the patient. Now this field of tension enters into medical education as well.
